## MacDill base access procedures – Ozone project 2006

(rev. July 19, 2006)

## A). NOAA-badged U. S. citizens:

Present your current NOAA ID at the gate; a separate base pass is not required. If driving a rental vehicle, present the rental agreement along with your current NOAA I.D. at the gate. A vehicle pass is not required for rental vehicles driven by NOAA-badged drivers.

## B). ALL foreign nationals, AND U.S. citizens without NOAA badges:

Obtain a base pass by presenting your current base access letter and standard ID (valid driver's license, passport, etc.) to the Visitor Center (VC) at the Dale Mabry gate. VC hours of operation are now confirmed to be

Sunday and Monday: 6 AM to 10:45 PM Tuesday through Saturday: 6 AM to midnight

The base access letters you have in hand expire 10 days after their issue date. We will work to generate new ones for everyone affected, and get them to you before arrival. (Copies of your base access letter should be on file at the visitor's center in the "NOAA file", but in our experience this has not been historically reliable.)

The above is the recommended procedure even for NOAA-badged foreign nationals. Once you have your MacDill-issued base pass, good for the duration of the Ozone project, you will be admitted without being affected by potential future changes in base security procedures.
